Fair Elections Portland Denounces “Enough is Enough” Flouting Campaign Finance Deadline

[PORTLAND, ME] – Enough is Enough, a political action committee that recently formed to oppose every question on the City’s November ballot, including the Charter Commission’s unanimously supported proposal to update the City’s campaign finance rules and establish a local “clean elections” system, failed to file its quarterly campaign finance report on Wednesday as required by state law.

“We are very disappointed, but not surprised that this anti-democratic campaign can’t be bothered to follow the basic disclosure requirements already in place,” said Anna Kellar, chair of Fair Elections Portland. “No wonder they oppose the commission’s more robust proposal.”

In recent years, other political action committees have disregarded the existing disclosure requirements, including Unite Portland, another group tied to Republican political operative Lance Dutson. The Charter Commission took steps to remedy that disturbing trend by recommending the creation of a searchable online database for municipal contributions.

Another proposal opposed by Enough is Enough is Question 8, which establishes a local Ethics Commission to enhance transparency and accountability for local officials.

Enough is Enough is the only group openly opposing the Commission’s campaign finance and ethics proposals.
